The immature stages develop in water in pools, containers, ponds, clogged rain gutters, or in some cases, wet soil or seepage areas. Most feed on living or decaying plant matter and are an important part of aquatic food chains. Many species can survive in very stagnant or polluted water.

Limitations include: (1) not all midge resting areas are treatable or reachable, (2) it is difficult to get complete coverage inside thick vegetation, and (3) midges keep flying in from breeding sites and repopulating the area. In general, nonchemical approaches are more suitable for effective midge control.

- Aquatic midge flies are non-biting insects found in lakes and ponds, and are known by many common names including blind mosquito and fuzzy bill. They do not bite, suck blood, or carry disease like true mosquitoes do, so they are more of a nuisance than anything.
